Precise diagnosis in three dimensions

Women who have mammograms at the UHS Breast Center think of Service Excellence in many ways. It encompasses the sensitivity with which the providers and staff care for them during the diagnostic process, as well as the personalized communication they receive when the results are ready.

Today it also includes the way the latest technology is brought into the picture. In 2014, UHS became one of the first facilities in New York to offer digital breast tomosynthesis, also known as three-dimensional mammography. This advance was made possible by a \$500,000 grant from the UHS Foundation for the purchase of two 3D machines.

The biggest advantage of tomosynthesis is that it reduces the need for additional diagnostic mammograms – which can reduce anxiety for patients and their families. Decisions about which patients may benefit from 3D are driven by clinical indications and collaboration between providers and the Breast Center team.

Patients have offered much positive feedback, and are grateful that the 3D option is available, right here in Greater Binghamton. It's part of UHS' commitment to quality and service. As Julie Quick, RN, director of the center, puts it: "We're committed to ensuring Service Excellence by giving patients the best clinical experience possible, and providing the results as soon as possible."

A Year of Making a Difference

The UHS Foundation’s work during 2014 resulted in enhancements to a number of programs, services and technologies within the UHS system.

In addition to providing grants totaling \$879,782 during the year, many other efforts by the Foundation yielded positive results benefitting UHS patients, residents and members of the community.

The 18th annual **Women Fore Women Golf Classic**, held Sept. 12, at Traditions at the Glen in Endwell, drew 160 women golfers

for a day of fun and generosity. The event generated funds to support prevention, early detection and treatment in the battle against breast cancer. Proceeds were included in the \$500,000 Foundation grant for the purchase of 3D tomography at the UHS Breast Center. Over the past 18 years, Women Fore Women has raised more than \$775,000.

UHS’ cancer nurse coordinator was selected as the winner of the UHS Foundation’s 2014 **Women Fore Women Health Leadership Award**. Ruth Manzer, RN, OCN, accepted the award at the annual Women Fore

Women tournament in September. Known throughout Greater Binghamton for her “Tea with Ruth” cancer support group and related work in providing exceptional care coordination for patients, Ms. Manzer was nominated for the Foundation’s award by several individuals, said Betsy Pietriyk, executive director of the Foundation. “A common theme from those who nominated her was recognition for the way she interacts with cancer



patients on a daily basis and how she goes above and beyond the call of duty to provide guidance, support and compassion to patients and their families,” Ms. Pietriyk said.

Proceeds from the **Empty Bowls** luncheon at UHS, featuring nourishing soup and handcrafted bowls, benefitted the hungry in the Southern Tier community. Money raised from the event is split between the Food Bank of the Southern Tier and the UHS Foundation’s Stop Hunger Fund.

The Foundation celebrated **Sports Medicine Awareness Night** at the Binghamton Mets game at NYSEG Stadium on Aug. 1. B-Mets players wore special jerseys that were auctioned off after the event, with proceeds benefitting the work of the Foundation.
