Two things to KNOW

1. Health equity will be a continued focus of POD selection. PODS must be accessible with ample parking and large areas to accommodate distancing. Personal outreach is critical for success.
2. Hospitals must receive approval by NYS before we are allowed to move beyond Phase 1A.

Two things to SAY

1. Please use www.SouthernTierVax.org to find out where vaccines are in the Region.
2. Do get your second dose. If you even have side effects they are manageable.

Two things to DO

1. Schedule an educational forum to reach your network. Materials are available to help Hub partners at www.SouthernTierHub.org
2. Develop a coordinated outreach plan quickly including your health systems and local health departments in anticipation of vaccine allocations for people with comorbidities. Get in touch in advance regarding “when, what and how.”
